
To submit a new article you must first register with the journal.

To register with JPAAP


Go to https://jpaap.napier.ac.uk/index.php/JPAAP/user/register

Complete the registration details. You will then have a profile on the system which you can use to login.


Please go to Edit your profile and add further details about yourself which will be used in your profile as an author and if you are reviewing for us.




To make a submission

From the Home page you can make a submission.




Or once you are logged in from here too:




Please ensure you read the Submission Preparation Checklist, Author Guidelines and our Copyright Notice before submitting your article.

Once you've read the guidelines use the blue bar at the top to move on submission.




You will now be in the administrative side of the journal so your screen will look a little bit different:

Follow the steps through.


You will now see a screen with your file uploaded. Click Save and Continue to then enter your metadata details.
